# Opening ceremony for Woodland Ways easy access footpath at Natterer's Wood

Woodland Ways opening ceremony will be on Wednesday 1st March 2006 at 10.30am. Before a gathering of residents and invited guests Nick Sibbett, Chair of Woodland Ways, will welcome everyone.

The path will be opened formally by renowned bat expert Dr. Robert Stebbings. The path means that everyone will be able to enjoy Natterer's Wood more easily.

The work has been funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund and St. Edmundsbury Borough Council.

Attending will be members of the local community, representatives of the town and borough councils, the Heritage Lottery Fund, the contractors – R & D Construction – The Green Light Trust, members of Woodland Ways, local schools who work with the charity, as well as many individuals who have supported this footpath development.

After the ribbon ceremony at 10.45 children and pushchairs will be able to use the path for the first time.

The children and young people, as well as adult visitors will be invited to explore the Natterer's Wood giant bat.

Natterer's Wood lies on the sloping hillside between Mount Road and Barton Road. Woodland Ways care for and develop the site on behalf of the local community.
