## **News from our woods**

### **Natterer's Wood**

Clematis at the western end of the wood grows vigorously, and swamps our trees if left unchecked. We are the ones that check it, spending many work parties last year cutting it down. We'll also be giving it a hard time in the coming months! Clematis does support a wide range of insects, and once we've finished there'll be plenty left.

### **Home Covert**

Back in March 2015 we removed the pedestrian gate at the Community Centre car park entrance to Home Covert. It was initially installed to keep out motor bikes and fast bicycle users from causing a hazard to pedestrians. However, we haven't had these issues at our other woods, so the gate was removed for a trial. Have you got any views on the trial period? Or have you heard what other people are saying? Let us know and we'll decide whether or not to put the gate back.

### **Woodland Ways Pond**

A family of mice is living happily under an old pallet in the woodland. We hope they survive the winter and the local cat population.

## Wildlife news

The mild autumn and winter has been good news for those animals such as hedgehogs that hibernate. The mild weather has meant that they can feed for longer into the winter than in most years, putting on enough fat reserves to improve their chances of surviving the winter and be fit and healthy in spring. Badgers too can continue to use the seasonal windfall of berries etc for longer into the winter.

It might not be so good news for the bats which hibernate deep under Natterer's Wood. If they can't use the cold weather to drop down their body temperature to under 8°C they will use their fat reserves up to quickly and may not be able to keep going all winter. Despite the mild weather, there are few insects after flowering has ended, so bats can't keep feeding in the same way that hedgehogs can. There have been reports of bats



flying in December around the country, even in daylight, desperately trying to find food. Have you seen bats flying this winter in Moreton Hall?

# **Trustees meetings**

Trustees meet four times a year to review our work and set the future of our charity. These meetings are open to all. In 2016 the meetings are on Monday evenings, on 21st March, 20th June, 19th September and 12th December.
