

The Moreton Hall Wildlife Group WOODLAND WAYS NEWS January 2023

Happy New Year! Your trustees are looking forward to a year uninterrupted by covid-19 and where our wildlife benefits from our work parties.

Wildlife news

Tawny owls have started to become audible in our woods. The male's 'to-whoo-oo' is most often heard, and is his territorial call. Less often we can hear the females answering screech of 'to-whit'. Listen out for them in any one of our woods after dark - the owls can move form wood to wood, so you may get lucky.

To help garden birds, clean and disinfect your bird baths and bird feeders at least weekly. Greenfinches were mostly killed off twenty years ago, with disease transmission through bird baths and feeders. Chaffinches are now scarce for the same reason. Convert your bird support facilities from disease-transmitters to actually benefiting the birds.

Snug in the chalk mines beneath Natterer's Wood are several brown long-eared bats, Natterer's bats and perhaps some Daubenton's bats too. They will stay there all winter and leave when the weather warms up in late March. The entrance to the Georgian or earlier chalk mines, which once supplied lime mortar for building Bury St Edmunds, are in private grounds so not available to us. In spring, the bats will use Natterer's Wood to forage prior to starting on their commute to summer grounds. Natterer's Wood is now far better for foraging bats than it was in 2001 when it was an arable field., so they can start their season in good shape. However, the initiation and expansion of Moreton Hall, the A14 dualling and other developments in Bury St Edmunds means that bat numbers hibernating under Natterer's Wood have been in long-term decline since the 1970s.

At Easter the work party is a week late so that it does not fall on a bank holiday. In November, some members have asked for the work party to avoid clashing with Remembrance Sunday.

Two events this year are being held to allow us to see a range of natural features not found in Moreton Hall.

In spring, we will visit the Norfolk coast to see the famous bee-eaters which nested for the first time in 2022. It's thought that climate change has allowed them to colonise from warmer parts of Europe. If last year's nesting isn't repeated, we will visit the RSPB nature reserve at Lakenheath Fen, home of bitterns and cranes.

In autumn, we will revisit after many years the well-known fossil site at Ramsholt Cliff, near Woodbridge. A decent hike along the Deben Estuary takes us to a soft cliff of 'crag' sand from which shark's teeth and fossil corals erode. We can hunt for these on the small beach. The Ramsholt Arms will be open afterwards for a fireside lunch, and afterwards you could explore Woodbridge, or National Trust's Sutton Hoo.
