Welcome to Spring

Its been a long cold winter, and a long cold spring, but finally it is turning warmer. Young birds, recently fledged, are in our woods, hedges and gardens, and the May Bush (hawthorn) is in full flower.

Raymond Ball

We were sorry to hear of the death of Reverend Raymond Ball, one of our earliest members. He was not in good health so never came to work parties, but he enjoyed Natterer's Wood whilst he was living in Whiting Street. He asked for donations at his funeral to be given to Woodland Ways, which was a lovely surprise for us and a great compliment from him. We were given £80 from these donations which was greatly appreciated.

Sylvia was also a long-standing member, and regularly came to work parties until she moved into Oxlip House. We were sorry to hear of her death, but had a lovely surprise when we learnt that she had left us £2000 in her will. Her daughters Jennie and Tina came from Kent to plant a memorial tree in Natterer's Wood. We enjoyed telling Jennie and Tina about their mother's contribution to Woodland Ways, and hearing their stories of when they were younger.

Where are all the bee-eaters?

In the last work party, we said that we would go to see Norfolk's famous bee-eaters; brightly-coloured birds exploring the warming climate to nest n the UK for the first time last year. At the time of writing, they have not been found nesting this year. We may be able to visit in June if they appear; ask for information about the June 'work party' activity a few days prior to that date.

Pond Covert

There was a stunning display of flowers in the orchard earlier this month, with the apple trees absolutely covered in blossom. After the local bees, wasps, flies, beetles, and other insects have



done their work, and pollinated the flowers, the tiny apples will start to grow. We could be in for a bumper crop this autumn. All apples are free to take, so remember to take a few to east (St Edmunds Russet) or to cook (Lady Henniker's). Normally, they are picked slightly too early, as people worry that if they wait until they are fully ripe someone else will get them first.

Woodland Ways Pond

In 2018, West Suffolk Council coppiced the edge of the woodland which faces on to the pond. This was to reduce shade, which was increasing every year as the trees planted in the early 1990s grew ever bigger. The coppiced stumps regrew extremely well, and earlier this year they were ready to be re-coppiced. We did this at the February work party, ably led by Mike and Jenny in the rare absence of Nick.

Work Parties

In autumn, we will revisit after many years the well-known fossil site at Ramsholt Cliff, near Woodbridge. A decent hike along the Deben Estuary takes us to a soft cliff of 'crag' sand from which shark's teeth and fossil corals erode. We can hunt for these on the small beach. The Ramsholt Arms will be open afterwards for a fireside lunch, and afterwards you could independently explore Woodbridge, or National Trust's Sutton Hoo.
