<u>April and June Workparties</u> - Natterer's Wood. We finished weeding the hedge around the bat meadow. The hedge is

doing better than we first thought despite the severe winter and the muntjac damage.

May - Visit to RSPB Lakenheath Fen. Twelve members enjoyed a walk around the reedbeds and pools of this fen which was until recently a carrot field. Norman Sills RSPB warden showed us many reedbed birds including reed warblers and sedge warblers and also habitat for cranes.

At one point some of us heard a distant bittern boom. A highlight for some was the sighting of fen ragwort, a very rare plant.

May - Two visits to Badger Sett at secret location near Ipswich. The hide was situated in a hobbit-like valley. At dusk on the first visit two badgers were seen. On the second visit 3 adults and 4 cubs! It was a magical experience.

June - Visit to Bradfield Woods owned and managed by Suffolk Wildlife Trust. SWT woodsman Giles Cawston took us on a fascinating 2-hour walk through the different stages of the 25-year coppicing programme which has carried on for hundreds of years. The diversity of species in this ancient woodland is amazing. SWT is currently fundraising to complete a green oak education centre in the woods. Giles got an excellent Heath Robinson barbecue ready for us, and we ended the day with an delicious feast of sausages, burgers and steaks!

Woodland Ways Future Plans

Woodland Ways continues to work with St Edmundsbury towards tree planting on proposed public space at Airfield Road but progress is slow. We are also strongly advocating a new community woodland at Lady Miriam Way and have attended a number of meetings with developers to influence allocation of land within the new 500-house development. We are working with the Moreton Hall Residents Association on this.

Woodland Ways are discussing the need for a new pedestrian bridge over Mount Road to connect Ten Acre Field and Natterer's Wood. Although the two green-spaces are just 30m apart it is currently a one-mile walk from one to the other. Following the publication of this idea in Moreton Hall Directory, 100% of a small response was in favour. Please keep your ideas and views coming in.
