Sunday 8 November Hedgehog houses at Natterer's Wood

Hedgehogs will no longer be homeless at Natterer's Wood thanks to some crafty constructions. Nineteen people made 9 hedgehog houses in just 2 hours, making a structure out of logs collected from Woodland Ways Pond, locally gathered branches to provide shape, and last August's hay to provide insulation. Inside these houses, the hedgehogs will be as warm as toast!

We don't know how many of them will be used by hedgehogs, but they will also be great shelter for frogs, toads, insects, and of course a great resource for fungi.

Sunday 6 December - Pond Covert

It was dark, cold and raining heavily fifteen minutes before the work party was due to start. But on the stroke of 10 o'clock it stopped raining, fifteen volunteers turned up and by the end of a successful session a couple of hardy souls had stripped down to their T-shirts! The main path through the wood was maintained, to the thanks of passers-by, and even the school seating area was surfaced with woodchips.

The woodchips are supplied free of charge by local tree surgeon and arboricultural specialist Stuart Langston, to whom we are very grateful. Re-use of locally produced materials also saves us from having to buy in materials from elsewhere, saving transportation costs.

Sunday 13 December – Baby Seals at Horsey

Maybe the daunting prospect of a morning outdoors on the north east coast of Norfolk in December (and a not-very-promising weather forecast) put a lot of members off the idea. But for the six people who made the trip, it was worth the effort.

At Horsey we enjoyed mince pies and mulled wine (many thanks to Luke Sibbett and Shirley Foreman) before setting off in winter sunshine along the sheltered path behind the sand dunes. Climbing the steps over the top, we saw the North Sea, the sandy beach, adult male and female seals, and yes... baby seals! Ahhh lovely. Even the strong biting wind did not stop us enjoying the fabulous wildlife spectacle, as good as anywhere in the world.

We thawed out at nearby pub over a good lunch before driving home in torrential rain.

Looking to the Future

As mentioned in the October newsletter, we are actively looking for somewhere to plant trees in the newer part of Moreton Hall towards Thurston, as that area is deficient in woodland compared with the older part of Moreton Hall where most of our members live. We have identifed some options but it is likely to take several months, at the earliest, before any real progress is made.

We are presently working with St Edmundsbury Borough Council with respect to renewing our management agreement for Natterer's Wood which expires in 2013. We hope that the on-going Council re-organisation saga does not cause big staff and cultural changes, causing a disruption to our relationship with the people we work so closely with.
